Philip Balderston is an accomplished real estate investor and developer. He founded Philadelphia-based Odin Properties in 2009, which now owns and manages approximately 5,000 multifamily units and various commercial properties throughout the Delaware Valley and Midwest. The company identifies and acquires underperforming assets, transforming them to realize long-term value for investors, tenants, and surrounding neighborhoods. Balderston is active in the community, serving on the Boards of the Frankford CDC and the Community

Education Alliance of West Philadelphia. He received a BA in Economics from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania and minored in Urban Studies and Real Estate.

Brett Schulman is Vice President at BET Associates, LP, the private equity investment division of Bruce Toll's Family Office. Previously, Schulman worked as an attorney in the corporate and mergers & acquisitions practice group at Blank Rome for nearly a decade. Schulman and his wife Jennifer have long supported the Museum, previously participating on the committee for NMAJH's annual *Only in America* fundraising gala in Philadelphia. Schulman received a BBA, with high distinction, from the University of Michigan's Ross School of Business and a JD from Columbia University, where he was a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. Prior to law school, he worked for KPMG Corporate Finance LLC, a mergers and acquisitions advisory firm. Schulman is a member of the development committee of Philadelphia Youth Basketball, a non-profit organization assisting urban youth by providing education and development through basketball.
